**SECOND EXTENSION OF
DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY AND ORDER**

The State of Oklahoma, ex rel. John Doak, Insurance Commissioner, on this 17th day of
November, 2011, issues this order based upon the following findings and conclusions of law, to
wit:

JURISDICTION

1. That John Doak is the Insurance Commissioner of the State of Oklahoma and as
such is charged with the duty of administering and enforcing all provisions of the Oklahoma
Insurance Code, 36 O.S. §§ 101-7004.

2. That pursuant to 36 O.S. § 6218, in the event of a catastrophe, the Insurance
Commissioner may declare an emergency to exist, and in the event of such declaration, the
Commissioner may issue a license as an emergency adjuster to any resident or nonresident
applicant.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. That on or about April 20, 2011 through April 25, 2011, a severe outbreak of
spring storms caused widespread damage to people and property in the State of Oklahoma,
resulting in a catastrophe and that as a result of this catastrophe, an emergency exists.

2. On April 26, 2011, a Declaration of Emergency and Order was issued regarding
the storms that occurred on April 22, 2011 through April 25, 2011. An Amended Declaration of

Emergency and Order was issued on May 9, 2011 to include storms that occurred from April 20, 2011 through April 25, 2011.

3. On July 15, 2011, an Extension of Declaration of Emergency and Order was issued that extended the May 9, 2011 Order for an additional ninety (90) days, to October 13, 2011.

4. On November 14, 2011, the Oklahoma Insurance Department received a request for an extension of the July 15, 2011 Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. That, pursuant to 36 O.S. § 6218, in the event of a catastrophe, the Insurance Commissioner may declare an emergency to exist, and in the event of such a declaration, the Commissioner may issue a license as an emergency adjuster to any resident or nonresident applicant.

2. That, pursuant to 36 O.S. § 6218, an individual licensed as an emergency adjuster pursuant to that section may only adjust claims related to that catastrophe.

3. That, pursuant 36 O.S. § 6218, a license as an emergency adjuster shall remain in force for not more than ninety (90) days from the date of issue, unless extended for an additional ninety (90) days by the Commissioner.

4. That, pursuant to 36 O.S. § 6218, the Insurance Commissioner should declare that an emergency exists.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE DECLARED AND ORDERED by the Insurance Commissioner that an emergency exists due to a catastrophe caused by a severe outbreak of spring storms on or

about April 20, 2011 through April 25, 2011, causing widespread damage to the people and property of the State of Oklahoma.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the request for extension is granted for ninety (90) days from the expiration of the July 15, 2011 Order, to January 11, 2012.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that emergency licenses may hereby be issued to those adjusters who are currently duly licensed and in good standing in another State of the United States of America, to serve as emergency adjusters pursuant to 36 O.S. § 6218 only to adjust losses occurring as a result of the catastrophe due to a severe outbreak of spring storms on or around April 20, 2011 through April 25, 2011.
