CONDITIONAL ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER AND NOTICE OF RIGHT TO BE HEARD

COMES NOW the State of Oklahoma, ex rel., John D. Doak, Insurance Commissioner, by and through counsel and alleges and states as follows:

JURISDICTION

John D. Doak is the Insurance Commissioner of the State of Oklahoma and as 1. such is charged with the duty of administering and enforcing all provisions of the Oklahoma Insurance Code, 36 O.S. §§ 101-7301, and the Oklahoma Bail Bond Act, 59 O. S. §§ 1301-1340.

2. James Manuel ("Respondent") is a licensed bail bondsman in the State of Oklahoma holding license number 200341. Manuel is appointed to write bonds on behalf of United States Fire Insurance Company and Roche Surety & Casualty Company.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On May 11, 2013, Isaac Church ("Complainant") paid Respondent \$300 via Western Union money transfer as bond premium. In exchange, it was agreed that Respondent would execute a bond to secure the release of Defendant Russel Chapman from custody in Lincoln County case CF-2013-87.

2. No bond was ever executed by Respondent to secure the release of the Defendant.

3. On June 3, 2013, the Complainant submitted a complaint to the Oklahoma Insurance Department ("Department") alleging that the \$300 was not returned to him after he and Respondent discovered that the Defendant could not be released from custody.

4. On June 5, 2013, the Department sent a letter to Respondent notifying him of the complaint and ordering him to respond.

5. On June 24, 2013, Respondent returned the money to the Complainant via money order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Respondent has violated 59 O.S. § 1310(A)(4) for failing to return premium to the indemnitor after no bond was executed.

2. Any bail bondsman or bail surety company violating any provision of the Bail Bond Act "may be subject to a civil penalty of not less than Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) nor more than Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) for each occurrence." 59 O.S. § 1310(B).

<u>ORDER</u>

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that James Manuel is CENSURED and FINED Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00).

Respondent is further notified that he may request a hearing within 30 days of the receipt of this Order concerning this action, and upon such request, the Oklahoma Insurance Department shall conduct a hearing before an independent hearing examiner. A request for hearing shall be made in writing to Buddy Combs, Oklahoma Insurance Department, Legal Division, 3625 NW 56th Suite

100, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma 73112 and give an explanation of Respondent's actions described

herein and any defenses thereto.

If Respondent does not request a hearing within the 30 days allotted, this Order shall become a FINAL ORDER on the 31st day following the receipt of the Order. Any fine ordered

herein is due within 30 days after this Order becomes a Final Order.
