#### The Real Estate Appraiser Board is moving!

The Oklahoma Insurance Department held a Groundbreaking Ceremony for the new building on November 26, 2018 which was attended by Governor Fallin, then Commissioner-Elect Mulready, Commissioner Doak and Commissioner Holland as well as a number of other legislative guests and Insurance Department staff. The new building will be located at 400 NE 50<sup>th</sup> Street in Oklahoma City, just north of the Capitol complex. The Insurance Department anticipates moving in late Summer or early Fall of 2019.

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### Welcome

### **Insurance Commissioner Mulready**





Glen Mulready became the 13th Oklahoma insurance commissioner after receiving 62 percent of the vote. He was sworn into office on January 14, 2019.

Glen is a recognized leader and champion in the insurance industry. Starting as a broker in 1984, Glen rose to serve at the executive level of the two largest health insurance companies in Oklahoma. In 2007, he joined Benefit Plan Strategies, a company helping businesses provide employee benefits and health insurance to their employees.

Glen has served as President of both the Tulsa and Oklahoma State Health Underwriters Associations and has been named State Health Underwriter of the Year.

In 2010, Glen successfully ran for state representative and quickly became the point person for the House of Representatives on insurance issues and was appointed chairman of the Insurance Committee after the 2014 elections. In this role, Glen passed legislation which resulted in more insurance companies offering service in the state, and he reformed the state employee insurance program to save Oklahoma millions of dollars a year while also saving thousands of dollars for those families. In addition, Glen authored and passed a plan which, when fully implemented, could save taxpayers one billion dollars in the state's Medicaid program over 10 years. These successes led to Glen being tapped for the leadership position of Majority Floor Leader in 2017.

Glen and Sally, his wife of 30 years, are the proud parents of three teenage sons, Sam, Jake and Will. In 2008, Glen and Sally were the recipients of Leadership Tulsa's Paragon Award for their work with Big Brothers Big Sisters. Glen is very active in the community having served on numerous boards and committees including Big Brothers Big Sisters, the Juvenile Diabetes Research Fund, March of Dimes, Shepherds Fold Ranch Christian Summer Camp, Crime Commission and Tulsa Tough.

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#### **FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS**

#### Q. Why does the ASC show me as expired when I paid my license before it was due?

A. The National Registry is not based on real-time data. This agency sends a data report to the Appraisal Subcommittee on a weekly basis. It could take up to 24 hours to show the current information.

#### Q. Why does the ASC have a different expiration date than the one that I was issued?

**A.** The Board issues credentials for three years, but you only pay licensing fees for one year at a time. When you pay your annual licensing fees, which includes your National Registry fee, the National Registry is updated, and the ASC advances your registry expiration date by one (1) year. They do not utilize the expiration date that is issued to you by this office.

#### Q. Why did HUD/FHA remove me from their rosters?

**A.** HUD and FHA retrieve their information from the Appraisal Subcommittee (please refer to previous questions). Please be aware that this office has no interface with HUD or FHA; if you have additional questions concerning those agencies, please refer all inquiries to the appropriate entity.

#### Q. How much continuing education do I have to complete and when it is due?

A. Each appraiser is required to complete 42 hours of continuing education during your three-year licensure cycle. Your license expiration date can be found on your paper license. Up to half of those hours may be taken online, but that is not required. It is required that you take at least 21 hours of LIVE continuing education. Online synchronous webinars will count towards your live education requirement. Separately, your USPAP update course is required every two years. Depending on your when you take your USPAP update course, and dependent on your expiration date, you may have two USPAP updates in one three-year cycle. As long as these are different versions of the USPAP update, you will get credit for them, as they are not considered duplicative.

Effective November 1, 2018, pursuant to 59 O.S. 4003, a one-time, one-year waiver of fees may be granted to lowincome individuals associated with an application for a new license, renewal or reinstatement of an existing or inactive license. Low-income individuals must show satisfactory evidence either of:

- he or she is enrolled in a state or federal government assistance program designed to assist underprivileged or low income individuals and families; or
- ii. his or her household adjusted gross income falls below 140% of the federal poverty line.
