

We provide objective counseling and assistance for Medicare beneficiaries (either those who are 65 and older or those who have been determined disabled by the Social Security Administration or SSA), their representatives, or people who are soon-to-be eligible for Medicare. The Medicare Assistance Program is available to attend health fairs, conferences, and retiree meetings to educate the public about the program, discuss changes, and alert about issues such as Medicare fraud.


SERVING

Trained MAP counselors assist and educate Medicare beneficiaries on all components of Medicare. Counselors are available for those who are 65 and older and those who have been determined disabled by the SSA. Counselors educate beneficiaries about what their options are, including basic Medicare, Medicare Advantage Plus, and Medicare Supplemental plans. Counselors are available year-round.

Beneficiaries on low, fixed incomes could be eligible for assistance programs. Counselors are available to help individuals through the process to identify if they qualify for programs such as the Low Income Subsidy (LIS), also known as Extra Help, which will help pay their monthly Part D premium and lower drug co-pays.
