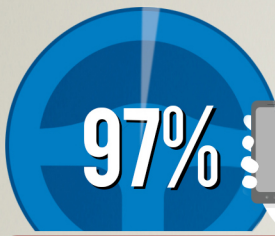
A 16-YEAR-OLD IS

*than the average driver.*¹

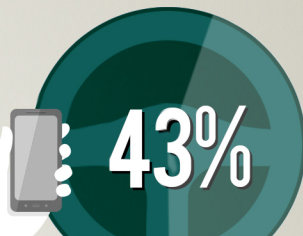


In most states, traffic tickets for dangerous driving can lead to points on your teen's license which could mean higher premiums or revoked coverage.

Parents who purchase an older car for new drivers could save a bundle on premiums.

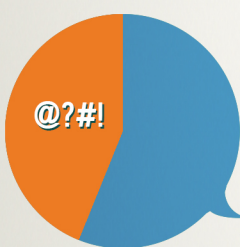
TEEN DRIVERS WITH PASSENGERS ARE
