**EXTENSION OF
DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY AND ORDER**

COMES NOW on this 3rd day of March, 2009, the State of Oklahoma, ex rel. Kim Holland, Insurance Commissioner, by and through Karl F. Kramer, Deputy Insurance Commissioner and issues this order based upon the following findings and conclusions of law, to wit:

JURISDICTION

1. That Kim Holland is the Insurance Commissioner of the State of Oklahoma and as such is charged with the duty of administering and enforcing all provisions of the Oklahoma Insurance Code, 36 O.S. §§ 101-7004.
2. That, pursuant to Oklahoma Insurance Department General Administrative order 08-0634-PMT, the Insurance Commissioner delegated to Deputy Insurance Commissioner Karl F. Kramer all powers and authority to issue orders consistent with the Oklahoma Insurance Code.
3. That pursuant to Section 6218 of Title 36 of the Oklahoma Statutes, in the event of a catastrophe, the Insurance Commissioner may declare an emergency to exist, and in the event of such a declaration, the Commissioner may issue a license as an emergency adjuster to any resident or non resident applicant.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. That on or around April 7th and 8th of the year 2008 severe storms caused widespread damage to the people and property of the State of Oklahoma resulting in a catastrophe in the State of Oklahoma.
2. That on April 9th, 2008 the Insurance Commissioner declared an emergency to exist so that the Commissioner could issue licenses as an emergency adjuster to any resident to or nonresident applicant.
3. The Insurance Commissioner approved extensions by orders dated June 30, 2008, September 12, 2008 and October 17, 2008.
4. That the Insurance Commissioner received another request for extension on March 3, 2009.


CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. That, pursuant to Section 6218 of Title 36, in the event of a catastrophe, the Insurance Commissioner may declare an emergency to exist, and in the event of such a declaration, the Commissioner may issue a license as an emergency adjuster to any resident or nonresident applicant.
2. That, pursuant to Section 6218 of Title 36, an individual licensed as an emergency adjuster pursuant to Section 6218 may only adjust claims related to the catastrophe.
3. That, pursuant to Section 6218 of Title 36, a license as an emergency adjuster shall remain in force for not more than ninety (90) days from the date of issue, unless extended for an additional ninety (90) days by the Commissioner.
4. That, pursuant to Section 6218 of Title 36, licenses for emergency adjusters should be extended for an additional ninety (90) day period.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that licenses of emergency adjusters issued pursuant to the Order issued in this case shall be extended for an additional ninety (90) days.
