  - PBM Clients consist of Private Sector Employers, Public Sector Employers, Commercial Health Plans/Government Programs and Union Trusts/Taft-Hartley Plans (ERISA-exempt).
  - The following is a breakdown of the 266 million Americans that receive pharmacy benefits through PBMs:
    18.0% Medicaid
    14.7% Medicare Part D
    35.7% Self-Insured Employers
    31.6% Commercial Health Plans
  - 2019 State Facts Total Prescriptions filled in Oklahoma 44,456,506
  - Claims processing

  - Types of Pharmacy Networks and contracting each, with advantages of PBM owned Pharmacies
