PATIENT'S RIGHT TO PHARMACY CHOICE **COMMISSION REGULAR MEETING-MINUTES AUGUST 18, 2022**

- I. Call to Order & Commission Roll Call was made at 10:00 o'clock am. Quorum of Commission members established.
- II. Pharmacy Choice Commission meeting minutes from May 12, 2022 meeting were approved.
- III. Kelli Price gave a review of the Quarterly Report to Pharmacy Choice Commission.
 - a. Commission member Greg Huenergardt acknowledged that a discrepancy in the 2021 3rd quarter complaint statistics. Kelli Price stated that the section will be corrected and submitted to the Commission.
 - b. Discussion on the trend of complaints and how resolutions are made.
- IV. Kelli Price gave a status review: PCMA v. Mulready before the 10th Circuit Court of Appeals
 - a. PCMA submitted an appeal to the 10th Circuit Court of Appeals.

Kelli Price presented a review and discussion of SB737, aggregate reporting requirements, OID Bulletin 5-2022 (at https://www.oid.ok.gov/bulletin-5-2022/), and the reporting template (available at https://www.oid.ok.gov/regulated-entities/pbm/)
 - a. Anthony Ferate initiated discussion on ease of the reporting template and collection.
 - b. Melanie Maxwell stated that the report should allow for the PBM division to see spread pricing as it occurs.
 - c. Mark Lewandowski started a discussion over limitation and definitions on information sharing, how many entities are in the que before PBM receives any funds/rebates, and cost of reporting.
 - d. Kelli Price specified that per violation per occurrence the minimum fine is \$100.
- VI. Glenn Disher led a review and discussion of pharmacy network adequacy standards as provided by the Patient's Right to Pharmacy Choice Act, inquiry and reporting procedures, and reporting template.
 - a. Melanie Maxwell posed questions over PBMs use of full/ partial leased networks, how verification processes are conducted, division of retail and non- retail pharmacy reporting.
 - b. Gregory Huenergardt inquired how PBMs list zip codes where they are noncompliant due to no pharmacy availability and if that makes them noncompliant.
- VII. Kelli Price gave a review of NCPA's ERISA and Medicare Part D Preemption Analysis.
