CONDITIONAL ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
AND NOTICE OF RIGHT TO BE HEARD

COMES NOW the State of Oklahoma, ex rel. Glen Mulready, Insurance Commissioner, by and through his counsel, Barron B. Brown, and alleges and states as follows:

JURISDICTION AND AUTHORITY

1. Glen Mulready is the Insurance Commissioner of the State of Oklahoma and is charged with the duty of administering and enforcing all provisions of the Oklahoma Insurance Code, 36 O.S. §§ 101 et seq., including the Oklahoma Producer Licensing Act, 36 O.S. §§ 1435.1-1435.41.

2. Sandra Mejia ("Respondent") is an applicant for renewal of a resident insurance producer license in the State of Oklahoma.

3. Pursuant to 36 O.S. § 1435.13(A) and (D), the Insurance Commissioner may place on probation, censure, suspend, revoke or refuse to issue or renew a license issued pursuant to the Oklahoma Producer Licensing Act and/or may levy a fine of not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) nor more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for each occurrence of a violation of 36 O.S. § 1435.13(A)(1) through (A)(14).

ALLEGATIONS OF FACT

1. Pursuant to 36 O.S. § 1435.18(B), "[w]ithin thirty (30) days of the initial pretrial hearing date, a producer shall report to the Insurance Commissioner any criminal prosecution of the producer taken in any jurisdiction. The report shall include a copy of the initial complaint filed, the order resulting from the hearing and any other relevant legal documents."

2. On or about October 4, 2018, at a preliminary hearing, Respondent entered a guilty plea to one (1) criminal felony count of conspiracy to traffic a CDS - methamphetamine, for which she received a deferred judgment, in *State of Oklahoma v. Sandra Mejia*, Case No. CF-2017-7606 (Oklahoma County District Court).

3. Respondent, who was actively licensed as a producer in the State of Oklahoma at the time of the aforementioned criminal prosecution, failed to report said criminal prosecution to the Insurance Commissioner within 30 days as required by 36 O.S. § 1435.18(B).

4. Respondent did not report the criminal prosecution at issue to the Insurance Commissioner until she submitted her application for renewal of her producer license to the Oklahoma Insurance Department's Licensing Division on October 2, 2019.

ALLEGED VIOLATIONS OF LAW

1. Respondent violated 36 O.S. § 1435.13(A)(2), violating any insurance laws, or violating any regulation, subpoena or order of the Insurance Commissioner or of another state's Insurance Commissioner, through a violation of 36 O.S. § 1435.18(B), by failing to report to the Insurance Commissioner any criminal prosecution of the producer taken in any jurisdiction within thirty (30) days of the initial pretrial hearing date.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Insurance Commissioner that Respondent is

CENSURED and **FINED ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100.00)**. **The \$100.00 fine is to be paid within thirty (30) days** made payable to the Oklahoma Insurance Department. The \$100.00 civil fine shall be paid by money order or cashier's check. Respondent's application for renewal of her resident insurance producer license may be granted upon receipt of payment of the fine and reporting of the administrative action. Failure to pay the civil fine or request a hearing within thirty (30) days will result in Respondent's license application being withdrawn.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED by the Insurance Commissioner that this Order is a Conditional Order. Unless Respondent requests a hearing with respect to the Allegations of Fact set forth above within thirty (30) days of the date of receipt of this Order, this Order and the penalties set forth above shall become a Final Order on the thirty-first day following the date of receipt of this Order. A request for hearing should be in writing addressed to Barron B. Brown, Oklahoma Insurance Department, Legal Division, 3625 NW 56th St., Suite 100, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma 73112. The request for hearing must state the grounds for the request to set aside or modify the Order.

Any such hearing shall be conducted according to the procedures for contested cases under the Oklahoma Insurance Code (36 O.S. §§ 101 et seq.), O.A.C. 365:1-7-1 et seq., and the Oklahoma Administrative Procedures Act (75 O.S. §§ 308a et seq.). If Respondent serves a timely request for hearing on the Oklahoma Insurance Department, this Conditional Order shall act as notice of the matters to be reviewed at the hearing, and the Allegations of Fact, Alleged Violations of Law, and penalties imposed in this Conditional Order shall be considered withdrawn, pending final resolution at the hearing.
