Dear Director Nelson:

I am submitting this Exchange Declaration of Intent Letter on behalf of the State of Oklahoma (State). House Bill 1512 became law on May 15, 2025 and grants the Oklahoma Insurance Commissioner (Commissioner) authority to establish and operate a State-based Exchange (SBE). Upon enactment of the bill, the Oklahoma Insurance Department (OID) has begun initial efforts to establish an SBE and transition off the Federally-facilitated Exchange ("FFE") for plan year ("PY") 2028 to best meet the needs of Oklahomans. Oklahoma also intends to transition to a State-based Exchange on the Federal Platform (SBE-FP) effective May 1, 2026, for the remainder of PY 2026.

The State, through the approval of HB 1512, designates the Commissioner, or his designee, as the primary point of contact regarding the transition to an SBE. The Commissioner has authority to comply with the requirements of an SBE and sign and submit the Exchange Blueprint Application. I acknowledge that the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) and the State may agree to amend this Declaration of Intent Letter to include additional information as necessary to establish the intended SBE.

We look forward to working with you on a successful transition as Oklahoma is committed to working collaboratively with all stakeholders to implement our SBE-FP for the remainder of PY 2026, PY 2027, and an SBE for PY 2028.
